



Double Glazed Windows

Every year we choose one major project to take on. In previous issues of the *Guysers Gazette* you'll see we've renovated bathrooms, put new carpet down, concreted new paths, etc. This year we decided to bite the bullet and order Retrofit Double Glazed Windows. This will be for our 2 large lounge windows and the large window in guest room 2. The order has been placed and these will be fitted in March 2023.

The window and ranch slider in guest room 1 however, could not be retrofitted. What to do, we asked ourselves. Well, with a bit of Kiwi ingenuity we double glazed these ourselves using 4.5mm thick Perspex Glass and selfadhesive magnet strips. This worked perfectly at eliminating condensation on the inside of the glass and has greatly reduced exterior noise such as rain or any road noise.

If you have previously stayed in that room before we think you'll notice the difference.

On the 13th of June Rotorua and the Bay of Plenty's inaugural Matariki Challenges took place featuring eighteen eateries from around the two regions creating stellar dishes to delight locals and visitors alike.

Designed to shine a light on the regions culinary scene while celebrating Matariki, the challenge runs for five weeks allowing the public to taste their way around some of the region's best eateries.

Celebrating local and discovering something new is at the heart of the challenge says event organiser Vicki Ravlich-Horan. "As New Zealand develops our own unique food, storytelling and provenance are key. The Matariki Dish Challenge is a wonderful chance for local eateries to start doing this and we are thrilled by the entries in this year's challenge."

With Matariki being an official holiday from 2022 the challenge offers a way for people to learn more about the significance of this time of year and celebrate local at the same time,

and what better way to do this than through food!"

While the Matariki Dish Challenge has a People's Choice award the coveted prize is the Champion award. This was decided by a team of "mystery" judges who visit each eatery, narrowing it down to our finalists, which are then re judged by our head judges.

The *Nourish Magazine* team employ Head Judge Kerry Tyack (who stayed with us at *Guysers* during his time judging the entrants dishes in Rotorua). Kerry is great at what he does. After years of judging and coordinating judging for the likes of Monteiths Wild Food Challenge, Cuisine awards, Beef & Lamb Awards, Toastie Takeover, etc, Kerry understands food and what is involved.

Rotorua café smokes the competition with "perfect" brisket toastie

The North Island has finally snagged bragging rights to the country's best toasted sandwich, with a Bay of Plenty café winning the 2022 Great New Zealand Toastie Takeover.

Chef Rich Johns from Rotorua's Okere Falls Store and Craft Beer Garden has won the hotly contested title – and brought an end to the South Island's three-year winning streak in the competition – with his 'Get Smoked, Pickled + Toasted' creation.

The winning sandwich consists of house-smoked, beer-brined brisket, McClure's Pickles, hop-salted mozzarella, smoked cheddar, watercress, and horseradish on Bread Asylum X Lumberjack Brewing spent grain sourdough with pickle brine sour cream and a beer gravy dipping bowl – all served up for a very reasonable price.

Rich Johns, who has worked at the Okere Falls Store café for the past six years, entered the *Great New Zealand Toastie Takeover* last year and just missed out on making the finalist round. Undeterred, he returned for another attempt, proving that second time can also be the charm.

Rich was so determined to use brisket in his toasted sandwich entry, he convinced the café's owner to purchase a smoker. The brisket was brined in a house lager from local brewer Lumberjack Brewing, then spritzed with McClure's pickle brine and smoked for 24 hours on site using a special rub.

A former wedding photographer with a deep passion for food and flavour, Rich switched careers when he decided photography took him away from his young family too often.

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He started working as a barista at Okere Falls Store, and after displaying an interest in menu development, moved to the kitchen, where he eventually became head chef.

Rich says he's thrilled to be crowned the country's toasted sandwich champion.

"It's still sinking in, but it's a huge honour," he says. "It reinforces the love and care we put into the creations at Okere Falls - we get lots of compliments from our diners on the food.

"We don't have a traditional menu and try to be a little different, so to win this shows it's paying off and it's so amazing to be rewarded. We've had so many rave reviews about the toastie and to win, it means a lot."

The competition's head judge, Kerry Tyack (who stayed with us at Guysers B&B during his time in Rotorua to announce Okere Falls Store as the winner), says this year's winner was highly innovative in using both the familiar and readily available.

"The Okere Falls Store is a craft beer café, and it was great to see they maxed out the influence of craft brewing - for example, using hop-salted mozzarella, beer-soaked brisket, and artisan sourdough bread made from spent brewing grains," he says.

"We also enjoyed the nod to wild food via the use of watercress, while using the pickles as a palate-cleansing element was inspired. Their juice lifted the sour cream to a pickle and dill inspired high.

"The entry also delivered epic mouthfeel and both complementary and contrasting flavours. No ingredient was superfluous, we gave it a perfect score for taste.

"We should also mention the inclusion of a brief note explaining the brewing philosophy behind the main ingredients. It tied everything together perfectly."

McClure's Pickles co-founder Joe McClure

says while the quest to find Aotearoa's tastiest toastie may be over for another year, it's clear the Kiwi love affair with the toasted sandwich is as strong as ever.

"This has been another watershed year for the Great New Zealand Toastie Takeover, one in which the judges were given the mammoth task of choosing a winner, while the entrants had to manoeuvre through the unique trading challenges thrown up by Covid-19."

"But everyone made the necessary adjustments in typically innovative ways, and we've had another hugely exciting competition."

This fifth year of the popular competition saw more than 140,000 toasties served up to customers across the more than 180 eateries vying for the title.

The Great New Zealand Toastie Takeover competition criteria required sandwiches to be toasted between two slices of bread and able to be eaten by hand. The toasties also needed to contain cheese and McClure's pickles, with all the other ingredients entirely up to the entrant's imagination.

Thirteen finalists were selected from the 180 entrants and were all judged on the same criteria, including presentation, effectiveness of preparation technique, eatability, taste, innovation, and originality.

Rich Johns and Okere Falls Store can now claim to the top toastie award by way of a bespoke trophy, a year's worth of McClure's Pickles, \$500 in vouchers to give away to customers and tonnes of promotion. The winning sandwich remains on their menu seven days a week (from 10am – 4pm) until the end of August – and potentially beyond!

Rotorua's latest restaurant to come into the Eat Streat complex is *Colibries Mexicana*. We were invited to the opening night on the 29th July 2022 to check it out.

Joint owners Baljit Singh, Mohinder Sawroop and Deepak Kunal of Eat Streat's *Leonardos Italian Restaurant* and the very popular *CBK* (Craft Beer and Kitchen) have now taken on the previous *Our House* restaurant to open their latest venture *Colibries Mexicana*.

Invited guests came along to their opening night to sample a range of their exciting Mexican dishes and cocktails.

Head Chef Pratik Bhosle who runs/oversees 12 restaurants in Auckland and has 15 years experience as a lead Chef was brought to Rotorua for several months to get the restaurant up and running and to train the other Chefs with the new menu.

What we tasted was far from 'run of the mill' Mexican food. It was fresh, innovative, delicious and colourful and all lovingly presented. If you don't like terribly spicy food, no problem. The menu features dishes that are not so spicy such as the *Barbacoa Short Ribs* with red mole sauce (which was fantastic) and the *Grilled Adobo Chicken* with corn cob and salad (also wonderful).

If you like Tacos, *Colibries* has an imaginative Taco menu with your choice of chicken, lamb, beef, fish, shrimps or vegetarian.

If you want to challenge your taste buds try their *Queso Fundido* (stuffed whole Jalapeño's).

To compliment your Mexican meal, try their range of Frozen or Shaken Margaritas. Yum!

Siplines[™]

We recently attended a Bed & Breakfast Association famil (familiarization) tour at Rotorua's latest tourist attraction – *Rotorua Ziplines* based out at Okere Falls.

Rotorua Ziplines is owned by Sam Hutton who also runs Rotorua Rafting and is a joint venture with Ngāti Hinerangi. Sam's vision of a new Zipline course based at Okere Falls and over the Kaituna River began back in 2019. His idea, which has now come to fruition after 2 years of Resource Consent, is to eradicate pests and vermin from the area with an intensive trapping program and to plant native trees on the once gorse-covered hills and to showcase this by way of an amazing zipline experience.

Suitable for a wide range of ages and abilities, a network of 4 ziplines, swing bridge, and boardwalks will have you in awe as you fly, walk and gaze at the stunning *taiao* (environment) that is Ōkere.

The 2.5 hour tour begins at their Depot which is right next door to the Okere Falls Store Cafe. Here you fill in some details, get kitted up in a harness and helmet and hop into a minivan that takes you to the Okere Falls carpark where the tour begins.

A short *Karakia* (Māori prayer used to invoke spiritual guidance and protection) is given and everyone introduces themselves before heading into the forest.

All the raised wooden paths have been thoughtfully created to go around existing trees, so they are a delight to walk on.



No concrete footings have been used in the creation of these paths, instead galvanised metal screw footings have been used so the entire structure can be removed without any damage or debris left in the forest.

There are several information signs on the walk to the first zipline and you may hear bird song from Fantails, North Island Robin's, Kōtare (Kingfisher) or Kererū that live and feed in this forest.

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The first zipline is 236 meters long with a clever system that stops you part way down the wire leaving you suspended above the rapids of the Kaituna River (where you may see people rafting). At this moment you can look around and take in the views. When you're ready there is a pull cord to release yourself continuing down the zipline at around 40 km/ph to the platform at the other end, where one of your guides is waiting to assist you and detach you from the zipline.

Building the ziplines in this area was no easy task. To avoid trimming any trees to get a line of sight, a drone and fishing wire was used to fly above the trees to take the line to the other side. Once the line was in place, slowly

thicker and thicker wires were pulled across this line until the finished steel cable was in place. It's an incredible feat of engineering.

After another zipline you then arrive at a wooden swing bridge that goes over a small ravine. You are clipped to a single cable above and you have to walk across this bridge which wobbles just enough to test your nerves and any height fears.

After that you arrive at a seating area where you are given a cup of hot Kawakawa tea served in a totally compostable paper cup that breaks down in the ground in a matter of weeks produced by a New Zealand company www.notracewaste.co.nz

After your cup of tea you have the opportunity to plant a native plant in the ground using your used cup as a compostable holder. You then write you name and date on a small wooden disc and attach this to the base of the plant.

This initiative is aimed at planting 60,000 native trees by the end of 2025 so that the Okere Falls area with thrive for generations to come.







Rotorua Ziplines immediate mission is to increase our indigenous forest by 6ha, which would sequester 26,000 Tonnes of CO_2 which is the equivalent of 3250 households worth of CO_2 !

There are two final ziplines on the tour; a long twin zipline where two people get to race each other over rolling farm land and a short zipline back over the river where you have the opportunity to go backwards and upsidedown if you wish!


